Klahoose Wilderness Resort Opening June 17th

A fabled fishing lodge located on Homfray Inlet in Desolation Sound – a one-hour boat cruise from Lund, B.C. at the northern end of the Sunshine Coast – has been renamed the Klahoose Wilderness Resort and is now owned and operated by the Klahoose First Nation. Four guest rooms in the main lodge and three separate cabins can accommodate on average 14 guests to a maximum of 26 guests at full capacity.

Klahoose offers the closest opportunity to Vancouver to view grizzly bears in their natural habitat and the first on the Sunshine Coast. Offered from mid-August to mid-October, the grizzly viewing tours take place in Toba Inlet where visitors will watch the bears feasting along the Klite River. The lodge also offers heli-adventures, outdoor activities and cultural Indigenous experiences. www.klahooseresort.com
